# 5 DIY Christmas decoration ideas from Instagram



Start by drying out a batch of thinly sliced oranges on a sheet of parchment paper, like Erica Chan Coffman at **Honestly WTF** and bake them at 175°C in the oven for around 4-5 hours. The key to keeping the colour is to dry them slowly for longer, so as not to burn them. Erica has strung hers with wooden beads, green tassels and bay leaves and they look perfect.



## 3. Nature-inspired ornaments

Use your wintry walks to inspire you for these cute nature inspired baubles by **@kimmyandbear**. These sweet little acorns have been painted in red and white to look like toadstools and would look great hanging on the Christmas tree or a twig tree, like this one from **Dunelm**.
