From tranquil treehouses to luxury shepherd's huts and everything in between, here is our edit of the UK's most romantic retreats.





The Bothy at Turley Farm Barns, Delly End, Oxfordshire

If the promise of a peaceful working farm in the Cotswolds doesn't tempt you, maybe picture-perfect views of a pond and a patchwork of fields as far as the eye can see will. A stay here means you can getback to nature – your only neighbours are the resident horses, chickens, cats and dog. The good life continues with the chance to take a dip in the swimming pond, plus, you'll get home-laid eggs and plenty of logs for the wood-burner, so you can snuggle up away from the outside world.

The Cwtch Hut, Usk, Wales

Really getting away from it all has never been harder, yet this pocket-sized hut, which translates as cuddle cottage, feels like it's barely been touched by modern life. Rolling countryside and castles galore are easily explored from this luxe bolthole, perfectly nestled between the Wye Valley and the beautiful Brecon Beacons National Park. And kayaking and canoeing are available on the River Wye if you want to get your adrenaline going. Or you can just lie back in your hammock, visit the natural pond in the grounds and cook al fresco at the fire pit.

The Loft Treehouse at Pickwell Manor, Braunton, Devon

What is it about being up high in the trees that feels so delightfully romantic? Maybe it's watching the light rake through the branches – or perhaps it's that no one else can see you. This treehouse perched in the woods of Pickwell Manor is a heavenly haven that's small enough to be intimate but large enough to feel luxe – you can stretch out on your king-size bed and there's a full-size kitchen for cooking up a romantic meal. Quarry Gardens Lodge, Moray, Scotland

Quarry Gardens Lodge is set on the Spey Valley estate, complete with a lake, a walled garden and a stretch of 18th-century cottages. The eight-acre Walled Garden is open to the public during the day but is all yours to enjoy in complete privacy after hours. Take it all in from the beautifully finished lodge, a serene secret retreat for two within the walls. Carry a picnic hamper to the woodland and bask in the joy of knowing you're in complete seclusion before taking a soak in the free-standing tub and cuddling up in front of the log burner.

Cleave Treehouse, Exeter, Devon
